<p>Swimming: 90% of the current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. 85% of the current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively and can perform safe self rescue in different water based situations. In the current Year 6 cohort there is a significant amount of SEND children who have a lot of barriers towards swimming.</p>
