The following information will provide you with an overview of the objectives the children will be focusing on this term. We hope you will find it useful

Being a Mathematician



Addition and Subtraction

- Recalling and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently.
- Adding and subtracting numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally.
- Adding and subtracting one-digit and two-digit numbers.

Problem solving and efficient methods

- Drawing pictorial representations
- Counting
- Checking answers using the inverse

Measure - Money

- Recognising and understanding different values of coins to £1.
- Recognising and understanding values of notes.
- Making different combinations of coins to make 20p.

Measure – Length, Mass and Capacity

- Comparing and measuring mass, capacity and length.
- Reading and recording measurements of mass, capacity and length.

Time

- Telling and writing the time to five minutes, including quarter/past/to the hour and draw the hands on the clock face to show these times.
- Recording the time on an analogue clock in words.
- Measuring and beginning to record time (hours, minutes, seconds).
- Calculating time intervals and developing a sense of the length of different units of time.

Directions and positions

- Describing position, directions and movements, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns. (Anti-clockwise and clockwise.)
- Ordering and arranging combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences.

Being an Author – Writer



- Composing and reciting poems.
- Forming letters of the correct height.
- Punctuating sentences accurately using capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- Investigating and using a variety of punctuation.
- Developing a stamina for writing.
- Writing for a range of purposes.
- Using a variety of grammatical skills including nouns, adverbs, verbs and verb tenses.
- Ongoing learning including phonic skills, sentence structure including punctuation and spelling with a focus on suffixes – ment, less, ful, ly,ing and ed, and words ending in –tion.

Being an Author – Reader



- Identifying and describing characters and their actions in a story.
- Finding sequence and re-telling events in a story.
- Reading words with ing, es and ed suffixes.
- Reading two-syllable words.
- Asking and answering questions.
- Making simple inferences about characters.
- Making predictions.
- Reading a variety of poems and creating our own poems.
- Reading a variety of non-fiction texts and becoming familiar with their layouts.
- Reading a variety of stories from different cultures.
- Asking and answering inference questions.

Being a Scientist










How do plants grow around us?

- Observing and describing how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants
- Finding out and describing how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy

What is home?

- Ask simple questions and recognising that they can be answered in different ways
- Identify and classify using their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions
- Explore and compare the differences between things that are living and dead, and things that have never been alive
- Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other
- Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats including micro-habitats
- Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults

<p>Being an Engineer (Design Technology)</p> 	<p>What is significant about polar exploration?</p> <p>Design</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Generate, develop, model and communicate ideas through talking and drawing templates <p>Make</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Select from and use a range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks (eg., cutting, shaping, joining and finishing) • Select from and use a wide range of materials and components, including construction materials
<p>Being a Geographer</p> 	<p>How do plants grow near me?</p> <p>Locational knowledge:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans <p>Human and physical geography:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles <p>How will we get around in the future?</p> <p>Locational knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the UK and its surrounding seas <p>Human and Physical Geography</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use basic geographical vocab to refer to key physical/human features <p>Geographic skills and fieldwork</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and its countries • Use simple compass directions (north, south, east and west) and locational and directional language (for example, near and far, left and right), to describe the location of features and routes on a map • Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks, basic human and physical features
<p>Being an Historian</p> 	<p>How will we get around in the future?</p> <p>History skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases related to the passing of time • Know where the people and events they study fit within a chronological framework • Asking and answering questions to show they understand key features/events <p>History knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally

<p>Being an Artist</p> 	<p>How do plants grow near me? Art & Design</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Using drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
<p>Being an Athlete</p> 	<p>Athletics- Run, throw, jump</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Develop power, agility, coordination and balance over a variety of activities; Throw and handle a variety of objects including quoits, beanbags, balls and hoops <p>Games</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Track the path of a ball over a net and move towards it; begin to hit and return a ball using a variety of hand and racquet with some consistency Work on a variety of ways to score runs in the different hit, catch, run games Work in teams to field; and begin to play the role of wicketkeeper or backstop <p>Real PE- Applying physical skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Focus on coordination with equipment and agility
<p>Being a Philosopher (Religious Education)</p> 	<p>Emmanuel Project Christianity- Why do Christians trust Jesus and follow him?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can talk about how Christians learn more about following Jesus as part of their worship at church I can say what some pictures, videos, storybooks or songs say about following Jesus or about who Christians say he is I can talk about possible meanings in stories, including stories of Jesus, and about any questions they raise I can talk about what is important to others, including Christians, when they first trust someone, and ask respectfully why <p>Judaism- Why is the Torah such a joy for the Jewish community?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can talk about some things Jewish people do together when the Torah is read in the synagogue I can say what the 'Ark' is and how it shows the Torah's importance for Jewish people I can talk about the meaning in a story, including stories of Moses, and I can ask any questions these raise.
<p>Being a Philosopher (PSHE)</p> 	<p>Jigsaw Relationships:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I understand that there are lots of forms of physical contact within a family and that some of this is acceptable and some is not I can identify some of the things that cause conflict with my friends I recognise and appreciate people who can help me in my family, my school and my community <p>Changing me:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can recognise cycles of life in nature I can recognise how I have changed since I was a baby I can identify what I am looking forward to when I move to my next class
